How we promote it

- We have an elected School Council and House Captain system in place. This is used as an opportunity to promote and teach about democracy and the electoral process.
- We encourage volunteerism in and out of school. This includes things like Librarians, Ambassadors and Digital Leaders. We also raise money for local and national charities, led and managed by our Ambassadors.
- Democracy is also promoted through our Well-Being lessons and assemblies.

How we promote it

- We have high expectations about pupil conduct and this is reflected in our Behaviour Policy. There are rewards for exhibiting good and caring behaviour and consistent demonstration of our values is recognised through such things as 'The Golden Book' and 'Value Ambassadors'.
- Through our school assemblies Well-Being sessions, children are taught how to earn trust and respect and are supported to develop a strong sense of morality; knowing right from wrong and doing the right thing even when it's difficult.
- The local police officer / PCSO visit the school to talk to the children and explain about their role in society.
- We run several workshops alongside local charities including DECCA and the West Bromwich Albion Foundation – these help to tackle issues relating to this value.

How we promote it

- Through our Well-Being curriculum, children are taught about personal responsibility, choices, ambition and aspiration.
- They are encouraged to take opportunities to follow their interests in art, music, sport etc.

- Children are encouraged to share individual talents and are given bespoke opportunities to showcase these.

- We have high expectations about pupil conduct and this is reflected in our Behaviour Policy.
- Through our school's values and Well-Being curriculum, children are taught to respect each other, to be cooperative and collaborative, be supportive and to look for similarities while being understanding of differences.
- Mutual respect is also promoted through additional Well-Being lessons, workshops and assemblies. A range of specific assemblies are delivered focusing on helping other pupils to understand specific special needs and differences.

How we promote it

- We have high expectations about pupil conduct and this is reflected in our Behaviour Policy and Equality Policy.
- Tolerance of different faiths and beliefs is promoted through our Religious Education curriculum. Children learn about different religions, their beliefs, places of worship and festivals. The children's work on this subject or whole school learning in assemblies is often displayed in the classrooms or around the school.
- This is supplemented by assemblies which also mark and celebrate significant religious festivals.
- Visits are made by local religious leaders and children have the opportunity to visit places of worship.
